Turn objects upside down (books, cups, shoes) and see if your toddler notices and turns them back the right way. Your toddler will begin to enjoy playing "silly" games. 20 - 24 months

2. Rhymes and songs with actions are popular at this age. "Itsy Bitsy Spider," "I'm a Little Teapot," and "Where Is Thumbkin?" are usual favorites. Make up your own using your toddler's name in the song.

3. Playing beside or around other children the same age is fun but usually requires adult supervision. Trips to the park are good ways to begin practicing interacting with other children.

> 4. Make a book by pasting different textures on each page. Materials such as sandpaper, feathers, cotton balls, nylon, silk, and buttons lend themselves to words such as rough, smooth, hard, and soft.



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
