## **What is osp.uoregon.edu?**

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Osp.uoregon.edu is a free site that parents can use to check their child's development. The Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) and the ASQ:Social-Emotional (ASQ:SE) are offered to screen and monitor a child's development between 1 month and 6 years of age. Results let parents know if the child's development is on track or if he or she may need to seek early education services to support development.

- Designed to increase early developmental screening opportunities in Oregon.
- Public service, pilot project from the Early Intervention Program, University of Oregon, funded in part by Oregon Department of Education.

### **Parents/caregivers can:**

- Complete the ASQ and the Ages & Stages Questionnaires: Social Emotional (ASQ:SE) online at home or with support from a child care or other provider.
- Receive results letter; a personal response by email or phone is available.
- Make decisions about any follow-up steps as suggested in results.
- Share ASQ results with health care provider at child checkups.

## Oregon Screening project – Providers Took

- Share results with childcare provider. Talk about strengths and areas where a child may need practice or support.
- Download play and learning activities to use at home and at school.
- Save information for child and family records.
- Monitor their child’s development every 6-12 months.
