



Oregon Screening Project

Check your child's development
Ages 1 month to 6 years

What is osp.uoregon.edu?

This is a free site that parents can use to check their child's development.

The Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ) and the ASQ:Social-Emotional (ASQ:SE) are offered to screen and monitor a child's development between the ages of 1 month and 6 years. Results let parents know if a child's development is on schedule, or if early education services may be needed to support development.

- Free, confidential site for parents to check a young child's development.
- Designed to increase early developmental screening opportunities for Oregon families.
- Supports parents to learn about appropriate development at their child's age.
- Offers personal follow-up from project staff.
- Free downloads of At-Home learning and behavior activities by age.
- Provides information about Early Intervention providers and community resources by county.
- Offers a Provider Toolkit for childcare and others to learn how to use the ASQ and ASQ:SE with families.
- Public service project from the Early Intervention Program, University of Oregon, funded in part by Oregon Department of Education.

Parents/caregivers can:

- Complete the ASQ and the ASQ:SE online at home or with support from a childcare or other provider.
- Receive results letter; a personal response by email or phone is available.
- Make decisions about any follow-up steps as suggested in the results.
- Share ASQ results with health care provider at child checkups.
- Share results with childcare provider. Talk about strengths and areas where a child may need practice or support.
- Download play and learning activities to use at home and school.
- Save information for child and family records.
- Monitor their child's development every 6-12 months.
